

WINNIPEG MAN MAKING GUINNESS WORLD RECORD ATTEMPT FOR VIDEO GAME MARATHON

Winnipeg, August 17, 2016 — In an attempt to break the Guinness World Record for longest fighting video game marathon, local gamer Daniel Bergman plans to play more than 50 consecutive hours of *Super Smash Bros. Brawl*.

Starting at 7 pm on Aug. 17, the world record attempt takes place at After Dark Lounge in Osborne Village. The venue will be staying open around the clock to accommodate the event. The 48-hour world record will be broken around 7 pm on Aug. 19.

The attempt is an effort to celebrate the gaming community and raise funds for local non-profit organization called Geekdom House. All donations contribute to developing a video game design program for inner-city youth.

The event is free and accessible for all ages, and the kitchen will be open throughout the entire attempt. After Dark Lounge has hundreds of board games available for anyone attending the event, and—for all the Pokemon Go players out there—a drink special that includes a free lure for the active Pokestop.
